14. To consider a request by NYCC to hold the County Council Volunteer Task Day on 7th August in Manor Vale with the task of knotweed management

The task on the 7th August has been advertised and will go ahead provided we get enough volunteers and the Town Council are happy for us to carry out the task.

Louise has previously organised the knotweed management on this site, so this is a new site for me. Louise says, the area of Knotweed is/was quite small, and last time we visited the site in Oct 2010 we were able to cut the knotweed in half a day. We had planned further visits however because we needed to combine the task with another half-day task at another nearby site (to make a full day) it has been difficult to arrange. As we haven't been to be site in three years, we don't know what the current situation is i.e. is the stand the same size or whether it has spread further. Apparently, in 2010 the knotweed just extended onto the golf course, so we needed to enter the golf course land to remove it there.

I have no direct experience of knotweed control myself, so can only go by the experience of other people and the published advice. Physical control by regular cutting/pulling is an effective control method on small or newly established stands. Repeated pulling over a number of years (approx. 3), eventually exhaust the rhizome and kill the plant. It is also important that the cut material is collected up, dried out and burnt on site to avoid spread. It is the preferred method to use on sites with native or sensitive species growing and where the use of herbicides is undesirable (e.g. SINCs). However, it is only effective if it is carried out continually, ideally 3-4 cuts annually over a number of years.

It is unfortunate, that we have not returned to the site since 2010. We are happy to visit the site in August but with our SINC work due to be suspended later this year we will not be able to continue with management on the site beyond this year. However, as I say, to be effective, control needs to be sustained. The Town Council will need to take this into account and that we will not be able to continue with the management in the foreseeable future. Ideally, we would prefer a continuation of mechanical control rather than herbicide if it is possible for Don Davies or the Town Council to arrange this. I can't promise anything but it is possible that some of our volunteers who live local to be site may be prepared to help out in the future if Don or the Town Council are prepared to arrange/supervise tasks.

I am happy to discuss the management options with Don and the Town Council.
