3. MATTERS ARISING

Response from Lynda Fairclough, Lead Midwife, York Teaching Hospital, NHS Foundation Trust regarding the provision of ante-natal classes in Kirkbymoorside;

Antenatal class provision has been held at Malton now for at least the last 15 years in which all pregnant women from the Ryedale area are offered antenatal education classes. This system has worked well and women are happy to attend. We currently offer a joint partnership class for women which involves joint working with Children's Centres, infant feeding, health visitors and midwives to provide a four week rolling programme throughout the year. This has recently been shortlisted for a Royal College of Midwives award for partnership working.

Our other option is for women to pay privately for classes held through the NCT or they can see an on line course on the York Hospital Website.

Julia our named midwife tried to do a 'meet the midwife' session in the Kirkbymoorside Children's Centre and discuss any other antenatal issues. This was not supported by the women in the area and was not found to be an effective use of midwifery time.

We also work in partnership with the Kirkbymoorside Children's Centre and younger parents are supported through this mechanism if they do not feel able to attend classes. The Children's Centre run many effective parenting courses and also we have the ability to have a family support worker if required.

7. To consider and agree a response to the NYCC consultation about future library provision www.northyorks.gov.uk/libraryconsultation

Following the public meeting held by County Councillor Val Arnold on 13 January 2015, the points below are suggested for inclusion in the Town Council's response.

The Library is valued very highly by people of all ages in Kirkbymoorside and the surrounding area. The current proposals for a new "model" of library provision are not a fair use of NYCC resources as the Kirkbymoorside Community would be expected to provide volunteers to staff all the opening hours of the library, when other towns would have library staff working with volunteers.

A fairer model would be for all libraries to be staffed by professional librarians supported by volunteers and with community support. We urge you to consider this proposal.

If the Library was to close, savings made in the libraries budget would very probably lead to increased expenditure in other areas, for example in Social Services because of an increase in the isolation of older people.

We believe that the County Council should look again at all budget areas to see where savings can be made in order to provide more funding for the library service.

There is a suggestion that "Stronger Communities" team would provide support and access to grant funding to cover the rent for Church House yet no one can tell us how many years the grant would be available for. (We have recently been informed that grant funding is to be withdrawn from Rural Action Yorkshire.)

We do not believe it will be possible for our town (population 3444) to recruit upwards of 60 volunteers who would be needed for the proposed Community Library.

We would like to arrange a meeting as soon as possible to discuss the future of Kirkbymoorside Library including the proposal made by the Town Council to NYCC in September 2014 that the Town Council office be located in the Library building.

12. To consider and agree a Grant Application from Kirkbymoorside 10k 2015 for £1000 to contribute to the cost of Road Traffic Management and Medical Support

Correspondence received from Petra Young in support of the 10k Charity Run Grant Application dated 15 January 2015

Dear Lisa,

Please see attached the PTA accounts for last year. I haven't had them audited yet, as I will have a problem with that. Last year, not all of the income and expenditure for the 10k went through our accounts and this makes it difficult if not impossible to get the accounts audited.

The Kirkbymoorside 10k has always been a Town event by the sheer fact that it starts and finishes in the town and the administration on the day is based in the Memorial hall. It benefits the businesses in town, which is great! It is and has, for the last 15 years, been organised by volunteers on behalf of Gillamoor and Kirkbymoorside PTA's with Kirkbymoorside PTA as the accountable body (AGM minutes confirm this). However, that doesn't mean that it isn't seen as a Town event. There is no question about that.

I don't quite understand how splitting the profit between the three schools validates it as a Town event?

We are aware that grants from the Town Council cannot be given to organisations outside the town and we are aware that neither Gillamoor or Ryedale schools are in town, and that only a

small proportion of the 600 children in Ryedale school will come from Kirkbymoorside (25%?). However, we do feel that the beneficiaries are also the local businesses, although that is difficult to quantify. If you are worried that most of the profits may be spent outside the town, please let us know.

As of yet, no decision has been made regarding any split between schools. We are currently working with North Yorkshire County Council's legal team and the Fundraising Standards Board on setting up terms of agreement to ensure that decisions regarding the Kirkbymoorside 10k are made in an open, democratic and transparent way and that the event meets all the legal requirements of the organisations involved. This will include who the beneficiaries are and how any profits of the event are split.

Also, thank you sending me a copy of the application form submitted to the Town Council. Because you have asked me for the bank statements and accounts, last year and this year, I assumed that the application was made in the name of the Kirkbymoorside PTA, as the accountable body for the event. I don't know why the application was made in the name of the race organisers. In my experience in fundraising, the applicant name should be the same as the name on the accounts, so I shall try and rectify this. I am not sure I can do this before your meeting on Monday. I gather that one of the race organisers is abroad. Please let me know if this isn't a problem for the town council and you are happy with the application as it is. To prevent us from being unable to audit this year's accounts, I would appreciate it that a cheque from the Town Council is made payable to the Friends of Kirkbymoorside C.P. School.

I hope this provides you with the information you require for your meeting on Monday. Please let me know if you require any further information.
