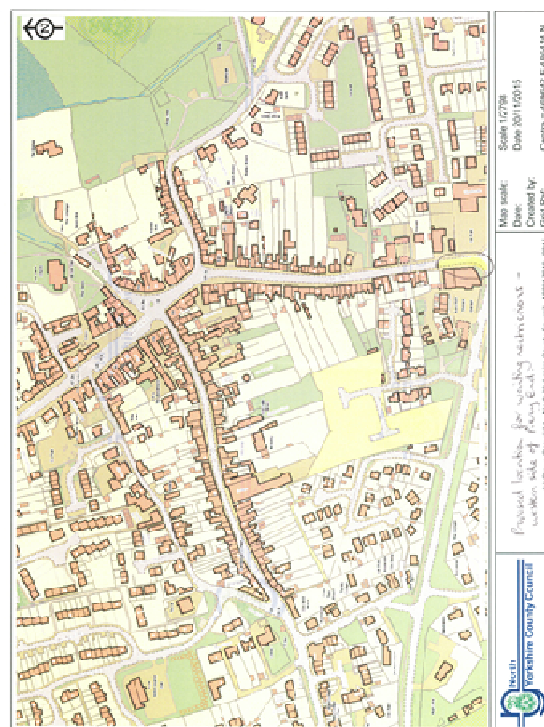

10. To note information received from RAY with regards to the 'Cold Snaps, Warm Homes' project and extend appreciation to the Kirkbymoorside Environment Group Energy subgroup who are actively involved in this project on behalf of Kirkbymoorside.

Rural Action Yorkshire is seeking three willing Ryedale communities to work with on a new project called "Cold Snaps, Warm Homes".

The project will trial new ways that we can raise awareness of the impact of cold homes on our health and also identify the coldest homes so we are able to offer them additional support. As an added benefit the villages taking part will be able to offer all households a free thermal image of their home to see how much heat they are losing and free advice on how to make your home more energy efficient. We anticipate this project will be of interest to villages who want to become more environmentally friendly, are keen to support people at risk of health related problems due to a cold home or would like to try new ways to engage residents in working together on a shared project.

So why are we doing this project?

26,000 homes in North Yorkshire are living in fuel poverty, 10% of our population, including 11,000 children. We have an average of 431 excess winter deaths and 3,000 emergency admissions to hospital every year in Yorkshire as a result of cold conditions and fuel poverty. These deaths and hospital admissions are avoidable. However, one of the hardest aspects of supporting people who may be in fuel poverty or at risk from living in a cold house is identifying them in

the first place. We are interested in a whole community approach to solving this issue and our project is designed to initially identify households that are at risk and which may require support - and then offer one to one advice and support to address the issues identified. At the same time it offers the whole village a chance to assess whether their homes are well insulated using the thermal imaging camera pictures.

What would you need to do?

We are looking for three village Parish Councils or community groups who would like to get involved. Your role would be to let your residents know about the thermal imaging activities and work with RAY to find ways to get local people interested in taking part. The staff at RAY would take the thermal images and print them off. You might choose to send these photos to residents in a letter or hold an event. RAY staff will provide advice and literature on making homes energy efficient and keeping warm, and also provide home visits for the households that were identified as cold and who request extra support. The project is completely funded and the support package is free for the three villages taking part. The funders are Ryedale District Council, the North Yorkshire County Council Public Health team, Northern Gas Networks and the British Gas Energy Trust. We will share information and outcomes from the project with the funders, but never share data or details on the households in the villages we will be working with.

Information received from Tink Reader of the Kirkbymoorside Environment Group Energy sub group

The Energy sub group was involved in RAY's Winter Weather Roadshow when it came to Kirkbymoorside last March. I mounted a display about KMEG's Thermal Imaging Camera (TIC) for the event. It's great news that RAY is planning to run a new project in 3 Ryedale locations this year.

We think it may be best for other communities to benefit from the project because we already have a TIC, although we are unable to provide the kind of follow-up services RAY is offering. Perhaps RAY could help with this if we were able to refer (with permission) individuals who need additional help/advice - but without taking away from what RAY can give to other communities? Also, we sometimes have requests from people living too far away from Kirkby for us to travel. With permission, we could put them in touch with RAY if they live in one of the three targeted parishes.

Now winter is underway we've been advertising locally, with posters and sometimes in the press, I attach a copy of the handout describing our project and how we use the camera.

11. To consider and agree the repairs to the Town Clock at a cost of £500

Background information

The Town Clerk has consulted with Chris at Wilson High Maintenance who estimated that it would take at least an hour to get the clock down, possibly longer if there are complications with the fastenings, weight of the clock etc, which they wouldn't be able to determine until the job started. This would mean that the minimum cost to take down and put back up the clock would be 2 x £60/hour + £70 plant hire i.e. £260 minimum. Additionally there would be the cost of transporting the clock to and returning if from Scarborough, approximately £60. Douglas Warwick in Scarborough would be able to carry out the repairs to the clock but are unable to provide a precise quotation without prior inspection. In 2003 Douglas Warwick estimated £1,193.00 plus VAT to investigate the internal illumination and if necessary fit new illumination and photo-cell control unit discreetly mounted. To reassemble the drum, set up and leave in good working order.

Total cost to remove, transport, repair, return and mount £1513.00 plus VAT minimum
