We could do the installation and maintenance of the system for the same price, it is no longer feasible to offer the support desk since the amount of revenue generated doesn't cover anywhere near the cost of the supplying that service. The contribution towards the service cost was spread over all the towns and since we are now down to possibly two towns the 24/7 helpdesk is no longer financially viable.

We can still provide you with an excellent managed town Wi-Fi solution, however support calls would have to be dealt with by email for individual users, anything service affecting will be picked up by our team anyway and dealt with so you don't need to worry about service outages being looked at.

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10. Community Defibrillator

c. To consider and agree to accept a quotation for the installation of the community defibrillator based on the quotations provided: contractor A £575 + VAT; and contractor B £450

Contractor A

Our fixed price quotation for carrying out the work required, as specified is:

£575.00 plus VAT at the standard rate (currently 20%)

The completed electrical work will comply in full with the latest edition of I.E.E safety regulations and our own high standards of workmanship.

A certificate providing details of the electrical work carried out and test results will be issued on completion of the work. The work carried out will be registered with local building control and will carry a 10 year warranty. Details of this are available on request.

The guarantee will not cover the existing electrical installation. This will be tested as part of the testing procedure.

Contractor B

Project; To install a clients own Defibrillator outdoor unit. To issue a BS7671 (2013) Electrical test certificate and sign works off with **North Yorkshire Building Control.**

Estimate;

I have pleasure in providing the following estimate for the works to the Electrical Installation. The estimate covers the listed works only.

Proposed Works;

A The installation of 1 x Radial circuit taken from the DB unit in the kitchen. This circuit will then run externally in 20mm White PVC conduit to match the PVC fascia board. It will come down from the fascia in high impact conduit to the defibrillator position next to the entrance gate as instructed by Mr Young.

B The connection method to the defibrillator is not yet known as I have not seen it, but an allowance has been made in my estimate for a standard connection.

All completed work will comply in full with the current 17thEdition IEE regulations standards (BS7671) and our own high standards of workmanship. All works will carry a standard warranty. The new circuit will be tested to BS7671 (2008) on completion and a certificate will be issued by ourselves and **North Yorkshire Building Control** for your retention. If deviations from BS7671 are found they will be brought to your attention as this estimate is for the above works only. Any questions regarding my estimate, please do not hesitate to call on the contact details listed below. Please note*All AED manufacturers state that there AEDs should not be stored or used in temperatures below 0 degrees Celsius. There is one exception to this where one manufacturer recommends that their AED be stored above 10 degrees Celsius.

Unheated Cabinets:

AED UK have been supplying AEDs and storing them in outdoor AED cabinets since 1998 and have never had a Defibrillator or Defibrillator battery fail. However you should always check with the manufacturer (not the sales rep) to see if their AED can be stored outdoors in an unheated cabinet. Additionally the cabinet should of course be weatherproof.
