12. To consider and agree the installation of additional signage at the play areas

We have had five reports during September from a resident in Ryedale Crescent about ASB in the play park – police have attended when available and encountered youths, during one of the encounters there was a smell of cannabis but no drugs have been found. There have been some alcohol containers left in the area near the bins but no youths have been encountered with alcohol on our visits. Anybody found in the play park have been given strong words of advice and moved on. They are usually local children between the ages of 13-17. We have the area on our patrol plan and have been attending the area when on late shifts. No children have been encountered over the last few nights this week. We will continue to patrol the area and move any children out when it is late or ASB has been reported to us. If there is a notice to say the play park is closed at dusk it would give us more authority to move anyone on causing ASB.

We could subscribe to a single supplier , such as smart street.co.uk , that have everything we need in one place , or we could be more bespoke..

There are three basic elements ,

Signs and information:
requiring a title..such as 'Stub it , Bin it' ,
a slogan ' mind your butt !' ,
a sponsor (KTC/RDC) , and ideally partner businesses

Info text suggestions ..

'Help keep KMS tidy'

"Smoking-related waste is litter and the Council has zero tolerance for it."

"If you stub out your cigarette (or cigar or roll-up) in a public place and do not pick up the butt, you are committing a criminal offence by littering, (and will be liable for a fine of ??")

Pubs and businesses are of course free to supply their own butt bin, noting at present they do not .

*Ownership and Enforcement *

We will need to decide a strategy to maximise engagement and the implied threat of enforcement . Here is where businesses will need to take some ownership , and we will need to maintain communication and positive reinforcement to ensure the scheme is fully adopted. Specific focus will be on the pubs, who contribute most of the buttlitter.

If you are seen to drop litter the Council will, under the Clean Neighbourhood and Environment Act of 2005, issue you with a £100 fixed penalty notice

I hope we can move forwards with this campaign swiftly.

I support any solution, other than no solution , though I would most likely use smartscene post bins and signs, as they are minimal, smart and have clear signage.
