Dear Parish Council / Parish Meeting

Notice of submission of the North York Moors National Park Draft Local Plan to the Secretary of State for Examination under the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 (as amended) and Regulation 22 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012

I am writing to confirm that on 2 July 2019 the North York Moors National Park Authority submitted the draft North York Moors Local Plan to the Government for independent examination.

The Local Plan includes policies and policies maps which will guide development and the use of land in the North York Moors until 2035, and indicates what kind of development will be permitted in planning applications.

The draft Local Plan can be downloaded from the Authority's website at www.northyorkmoors.org.uk/localplan along with the sustainability appraisal, policies maps, representations statement, copies of representations and other supporting documentation. Copies are also available to view during normal office hours at The North York Moors National Park Authority Offices in Helmsley and also at The Danby Moors Centre and Sutton Bank - please check website for opening times. Further locations of where

the draft Plan can be viewed are set out in the accompanying Submission Statement.

The North York Moors National Park Local Plan will now be subject to an independent examination conducted by the Planning Inspectorate. The examination is a continuous process running from submission through to the receipt of the Inspector's report. Part of the process will involve hearing sessions where those invited to attend, will have the opportunity to respond to matters raised by the Inspector.

Please note that this is not an opportunity to make further representations regarding the Plan's content. Those who made representations at the pre-submission (Publication) stage will, if the Inspector deems it appropriate, be offered the opportunity to appear at the examination.

Those consultees who made representations to the Pre-Submission draft (Regulation 19) draft Plan will be notified when details of the Examination in Public are known. This will take place at least six weeks prior to the Examination, in accordance with Regulation 24 of the Local Plan Regulations. To assist the Inspector, an independent Programme Officer has also been appointed - Liz Sheard. Contact details will be placed on the website.

The Programme Officer is responsible for all procedural matters of the examination and all future correspondence should be via the Programme Officer. After submission, communication will primarily be via the website or sent by email from the Programme Officer.

14. To consider and agree the request of the Kirkbymoorside Environment Group to submit street furniture licences for tree planting along the A170, Old Road and West Pasture.

Dear Town Councillors,

I am writing on behalf of the Kirkbymoorside Environment Group. We have recently launched a new project with the aim of planting trees around the town. With the government declaring a climate emergency we believe the time is now to act. Planting trees come with numerous benefits. They capture carbon, they absorb pollution, their homes for wildlife, they create shade, they absorb water and they also look nice.

The trees themselves will come from the Woodland Trust, for free, as it is a community project. We would apply for tree packs after we are given the right permissions. They will be British native tree's grown in England. Once the tree's have been delivered we would need to plant them, water them and let them grow.

The main areas we would like to target is mainly along the A170, Old road and West Pasture,. as these are the main areas with grass verges. We also feel the football/ cricket field has the space available to have some extra trees planted. It would also be great to have some trees planted in the children's play park on Old Road. This would create some shade and extra interest in the

park. Please could the council submit a street furniture licence for the trees along the A170, Old Road and West Pasture. Please find attached the maps with highlighted areas.

We have taken advice from NYCC Area 4 Highways, and Tim Coyne has seen the attached maps. Tim has provided detailed guidelines about planting trees in public places, including details of different species that may or may not be planted.
