

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

**8. To receive information on progress of the proposed introduction of a 20mph speed limit on West End, Westfield and Tinley Garth**

The Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government has advised that the appropriate sum for the purpose of section 137(4)(a) of the Local Government Act 1972 for parish and town councils in England for 2020-21 is £8.32

This is the amount that results from increasing the amount of £8.12 for 2019-2020 by the percentage increase in the retail index between September 2018 and September 2019, in accordance with Schedule 12B to the 1972 Act.

- 17. To consider and agree the request of PCSO Sean Simpson for access to the Moorside Room during late shifts**

A request has been received from PCSO Sean Simpson for access to the Moorside Room when he is on late shifts. Closure of the office in Helmsley means that the closest Police Station is Malton and a venue in Kirkbymoorside to which he may return for comfort breaks and meals would be a more effective use of time as opposed to travelling to Malton. It would also ensure a more frequent police presence in the town.

- 18. To consider and agree to support the Local Electricity Bill and sign up to the campaign for more local, clean energy generation that would benefit local communities**

I am writing to ask that you please join 27 Parish, Town and Community Councils that have already resolved to support the Local Electricity Bill.

The Bill, if made law, would empower local communities to sell locally generated clean energy directly to local customers by establishing a statutory Right to Local Supply. This is currently impossible because of the huge setup and running costs involved in doing so.

The ultimate result of this would be:

1. Local communities and businesses could buy their electricity from a local energy company.
2. Building more local renewable energy would be financially viable.
3. Communities would benefit from the revenues that new local energy supply companies would generate, such as more local skilled jobs, energy efficiency schemes and investment in local facilities.

Could you please help by doing the following?

1. Ask Kirkbymoorside Town Council to support the Local Electricity Bill. A suggested resolution is further below.

\*\* Council Draft Resolution

That Kirkbymoorside Town Council

I) notes that the Local Electricity Bill

\* aims to address the current situation, whereby the very large financial setup and running costs involved in selling locally generated renewable electricity to local customers result in it being impossible for local renewable electricity generators to do so,

\* if made law, would make these financial costs proportionate to the scale of a renewable electricity supplier's operation and therefore empower councils, together with their communities, to sell locally generated renewable electricity directly to local people, businesses and organisations, and

\* would result in councils or community organisations that set up local renewable electricity companies receiving revenues that could be used to help fund local greenhouse gas emissions reduction measures and to help improve local services and facilities

II) accordingly resolves to support the Local Electricity Bill, supported by a cross-party group of 115 MPs during the 2017-19 Parliamentary session; and

III) further resolves to write to the organisers of the campaign for the Bill, Power for People, (at 8 Delancey Passage, Camden, London NW1 7NN or [info@powerforpeople.org.uk](mailto:info@powerforpeople.org.uk)) expressing its support.

**19. To note the consultation on the first draft of the Local Industrial Strategy written by the York, North Yorkshire and East Riding (YNYER) Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP) is running from 13th to 31st January 2020 allowing businesses and the public to give their views on this major plan for growth**

The York, North Yorkshire and East Riding (YNYER) Local Enterprise Partnership is currently developing its Local Industrial Strategy (LIS) and is calling on everyone who lives and works in the region to share their views.

The strategy, which will be submitted to the UK Government in March, will determine the next 20 years of productivity and growth in the region.

Following a period of region-wide engagement, the YNYER LEP has written a first draft of its Local Industrial Strategy and is now launching a second consultation for businesses and the public to give their views on this major plan for growth.

The LEP would like as many people as possible to have the opportunity to help shape the final submission. The consultation is running from Monday 13th January - Friday 31st January 2020.
