Provide a <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>detailed description of the project</li> <li>evidence of the need for your project,</li> <li>and show who will benefit from it</li> </ul>	<p>We would like to arrange a “colour run” for the whole school (students and teachers), in July, just before the Summer holidays. Colour runs have become increasingly popular over the last few years, either with a fundraising aim, or just to promote exercise and healthy living. Essentially, the participants run around a course wearing a white tshirt, and whilst running, they have lots of brightly coloured powder thrown over them at various stations along the course. It’s a fun event, that everyone can join in and enjoy.</p> <p>The colour run will be free to enter, but we will sell drinks and ice lollies etc afterwards, to raise funds towards our other projects.</p> <p>Since September, the school’s 4 “houses” have been busy earning points for kindness and good behaviour. The points are awarded by the teaching staff. The number of points awarded to each house each week are then added up and publicised on the weekly newsletter. Each house has been given the challenge to beat their own score from the previous half term. This ensures that there are no “losers” if one house continually performs better than another, so everyone remains engaged and motivated. The points are not given to specific individuals, just to the house as a whole, to encourage the students to work as a team.</p> <p>The students are really enjoying the challenge of collecting house points, and it is a talking point amongst them each week when the scores are publicised. The real benefit, of course, is their improved behaviour within school and at home.</p> <p>In addition to the house points, another new initiative which started this term is the “daily mile” (or in our school’s case, the 3 times a week mile!). This initiative was also started nationwide some years ago, but it has not been adopted by our school until now. The original concept was that all children in a particular school run a mile around the school grounds every day. Studies</p>

	<p>show that participating in the daily mile can improve student behaviour in schools, for example, by improving focus, concentration and confidence. Thousands of schools have adopted the daily mile, or their adapted version of it.</p> <p>All children in our school are now able to run the mile 3 times per week, on Mon, Wed and Thu mornings, if they wish to. It was decided not to make it compulsory, but to encourage and motivate the children to join in. So far it has proved really popular, and we expect that even those who are more hesitant will feel encouraged to join in, as they see how much the participants are enjoying taking part.</p> <p>We would like to arrange the colour run as an end of term treat for the children, to reward them for doing so well in the house points competitions, and the daily mile challenge, and for collectively improving their behaviour in and out of school. Whilst the colour run will be a treat, it has the added benefit of encouraging the whole school to take part in an exercise activity, and promoting a healthy lifestyle. It will also be a chance for all of the students and teachers to unwind and enjoy themselves together, after a long Summer term of hard work, and will aid mental well being.</p> <p>We will arrange the colour run, and we will invite parents and carers to come and watch the event, and possibly to join in. As mentioned, we will sell drinks and ice lollies etc, at the end of the event, to raise some funds for our other projects.</p>
What are the full costs of the project (including VAT if applicable)	<p>We can buy a "colour run" package which currently costs £10.80 per person. We would need to buy enough for 260 students and teachers, which is a total cost of £2800.</p> <p>The colour run package includes for each person:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• powder to be thrown by "helpers" during the run</li> <li>• white tshirt to wear during the run</li> <li>• a pair of very bright sun glasses to wear in the run (to prevent powder getting in the eyes)</li> <li>• extra powder for a "powder cloud" (see below)</li> <li>• a medal</li> </ul> <p>A powder cloud is an additional fun event for the end of the run. Each participant is given a small bag of powder and stands together in small groups. Everyone then throws their powder in the air at the same time, creating a great finale to the challenge and some brilliant photos.</p> <p>There are lots of colour run marketing/publicising materials available for free on the internet, which we will use in the lead up to the run.</p> <p>The powder that we will use is non toxic, and does not contain anything harmful to either people or the environment.</p> <p>The website below has more information on school colour runs, should you wish to read further:</p> <p><a href="https://www.ukschoolrun.com/colour-run">https://www.ukschoolrun.com/colour-run</a></p>
