Provide a <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• detailed description of the project</li> <li>• evidence of the need for your project,</li> <li>• and show who will benefit from it</li> </ul>	<p><b>Volunteer travel/costs</b></p> <p>We deliver a community café style drop in at Kirkbymoorside where we provide a café style drop in which provides us with 25 volunteers, they undertake baking/cooking classes , undertake food hygiene, fire safety coursesand are encouraged to go on our "increased work skills scheme".This scheme equips people with issues to help them to get into paid work ,increase confidence and self esteem.</p> <p>We have approximately 60 people attending at Kirkbymoorside community cafe (4 volunteers)and drop in service. We provide "Craft" session (18 + people and 3 volunteers) ,1-1 support,benefit advice (regular 10 people),gardening sessions are going to be available for green spaces in the kirkbymoorside community if they would like some sessions/volunteers,also a walking group which have up to 25 people (8 volunteers) regularly attending weekly at Kirkbymoorside and the drivers to take people to the walking destination,a quiz and games in then afternoon 16 people attending( 3 volunteers).We now we have the clothes bank which we will deliver in all our venues across Ryedale and volunteering.We also provide the “community one stop” which hosts over 10 other organisations available for local people to access support.(30 people) attending.</p> <p>To provide all our services we heavily relay on volunteers, each session we run ,or café/drop ,we curenly have 18 -20 volunteers (in kirkbymoorside) to enable us to provide these sessions in a safe manor and with only a handful of staff. To have the volunteers we need to be able to train them in food hygeine, fire safety and H&amp;Safety.We also need to pay for their travel to attend so they are not out of pocket as many are on pensions or benefits.This</p>

	cost is nothing compared to their time they give to us and the skills they bring, but neither the less it's still a cost.
