**13. To consider support of the request by a member of the public to North Yorkshire Council Street Lighting for the addition of a shield to lantern LP3 on Crown Square in addition to reduced night light within the Conservation area**

I was wondering if the Town Council would consider supporting my request (in the trail below) to NYC Highways to have the streetlight in front of our house in Crown Square shielded, so that it doesn't shine directly onto our bedroom window?

I wonder if the Council would also consider discussing with NYC whether LED lights within the Conservation area might be either dimmed, or turned off entirely between midnight and five a.m.? The evidence that intense LED lighting causes harm both to human health and the natural environment is quite substantial and continuously growing.

Good Morning, I'm hoping you are able to do something about the LED streetlight situated at the front of my house. It is situated within a couple of metres of [REDACTED] window. There is no effective shielding on the light and it casts directly onto the window. The light is exceptionally bright, and cold in spectrum terms, which has been shown to have significant negative implications for both human health and the natural environment. It also impacts significantly on our view of the night sky, and is inappropriate/intrusive in terms of impact on the Kirkbymoorside Conservation Area. Having read the light pollution section on the NYC website, it looks to me like this street light may meet the definition of a statutory nuisance. I appreciate that street lighting is viewed as important by many people, but I feel that it would be reasonable as an interim measure for this light to be shielded, so that it does not cast onto our bedroom window, and within a reasonable timeframe be relocated, or replaced (with input into a suitable design from the Conservation Officer) with something that is appropriate to both the area and natural environment.
