At the beginning of September the recycling bins at the skate park were very badly damaged by vandals. The incident was reported to the police and arrangements made to replace the bins, the cost of which is almost £1000!





Fortunately the Town Council has been able to claim the majority of the costs on insurance, however it is important to appreciate that damage of this kind comes at a price.

All the street furniture, which includes litter bins, play equipment, street lights, planters and notice boards are provided for the benefit of the local community and paid for out of public money. When public property is damaged it impacts the whole community.

Free public Wi-Fi in the town centre

The usage reports for the public Wi-Fi in the town centre show consistently good use of this free service by both visitors and locals alike. The Town Council is proud to be the only council in Ryedale to have provided free Wi-Fi.

The public wi-fi is not restricted by time but is set to a data allowance of 1GB and is available anywhere within the transmission zone which spans from the top of Piercy End extending the full length of Market Place and High Market Place and branching into Church Street. There is no password requirement you simply need to enter your email address.

The Police should be contacted for any incidents relating to criminal activity, traffic offences and anti-social behaviour. It is important that all non-emergency incidents are reported to the Neighbourhood Policing team via **101** and emergencies reported to **999**.

Advice from the Neighbourhood Policing team is that if someone thinks something is suspicious then the police would encourage them to call 101 so they can build up an intelligence picture. When reporting incidents/suspicions you will need to provide specifics such as time(s), date(s), location of the incident and/or addresses of individuals involved. The information must come from the person witnessing the issue. Second and third hand reports cannot be submitted for intelligence.

The Memorial Hall Committee is responsible for management of the Memorial Hall and the weekly market that takes place every Wednesday.

The Kirkby Community Fridge is a volunteer run, not-for-profit enterprise initiative, part of The National Community Fridge Network.

Through the development of the 'Community Fridge', the volunteers want to prevent tonnes of good-quality food from going to landfill and provide a social hub for the community. Anyone in the community can make use of the Community Fridge.

The initiative will help local businesses reduce their own food waste footprint by donating surplus, edible food whilst supporting Kirkbymoorside's economy.

Development of the Kirkby Community Fridge has been inspired by the success of the Ryedale Free Fridge, Malton, which, when it was established in 2018, was the first of its kind in North Yorkshire. Other North Yorkshire towns such as Filey, Hunmanby, Pickering, Scarborough and Norton also now have their own Fridges.

We are currently looking to work with local businesses to stock our fridge and for volunteers to help maintain the fridge or collect the donations of food from businesses.

Three words for a faster emergency response

Being able to give your precise location in an emergency can save vital time and lives. To find you more easily in an emergency, many UK



Emergency Services are encouraging you to share your 3-word address. Make sure you're prepared by downloading the free @what3words app so you can help 999 #KnowExactlyWhere the emergency is.



How do I use what3words in an emergency?

If you're at the scene of an incident, use the what3words app to find the three words for your current location.

1. Find the 3 word address for your current location on the free what3words app for iOS and Android. It works offline – ideal for areas with unreliable data connection.

2. Share your 3 word address over the phone to the call handler or copy and paste it into a text message.

3. The emergency service can then coordinate a response directly to the exact location where help is needed.
