## Kirkbymoorside Christmas Market

The Market, which is now in its 8th year, will be held on Saturday November 26th from 10am to 3pm. Up to 40 stalls selling a variety of Christmas gifts will line the festive Market Place, and both the ground and first floor of the Memorial Hall.

The stalls will offer goods and produce from mainly local crafts people working in a range of materials, including metal, textiles, pottery and wood. Local artists, organisations and charities will also have stalls, all with goods at competitive prices.

There will be a selection of local food producers, selling organic produce, bacon (a first this year!), bread, honey and fresh coffee beans.

For the children there will be activities in the Library from 10.30 am - 12.00, a free Santa's Grotto in the Dugout of the Memorial Hall from 12.00 until 2.00 pm and face painting (early afternoon).

The Kirkbymoorside Brass Band will provide a soundtrack to the market, playing favourite carols, from 11am.

The Town Council has arranged **FREE PARKING** for the Christmas Market in the Town Farm Car Park. Vouchers will be available from the Post Office and the Library from 24 November and must be displayed in your vehicle.

Quarterly Permits cost £52.00, Annual permits cost £208.00 For as little as **£1.00** a week you can park for up to 2 hours, any time, any day as often as you like (within the local car park byelaws) with a **Short Stay Permit**.

# Kirkbymoorside Town Council

The full Council meets on the third Monday of each month except for August. Meetings are open to the public, start at 7.30pm and are held in Church House, High Market Place, Kirkbymoorside. Agendas are displayed in the office window, on the Town Council notice board and can be viewed via the website (see address below).

### Parking in Kirkbymoorside

As you will know from previous items in the Moorsider, since June 2013 the Town Council has been pursuing the possibility of short term car parking in the town centre. Finally in September 2016 the short term parking came into effect. The Town Council specifically requested that the bays be marked by 'T' markers on the curb only. Unfortunately this request was denied by NYCC Highways Authority due to the necessity to mark the bays with broken lines in order to make the Traffic Order enforceable.

The effect of the short term parking enforcement is clearly evident as there is a greater turnover of spaces for customers of the various businesses in the town centre allowing residents and visitors alike to pop into Kirkbymoorside. This does mean that there has been a knock on effect to the vehicles parking along the length of Old Road as it is

apparent that people are reluctant to use the Town Farm car park.

**Should you have any concerns with regards to street parking in Kirkbymoorside please direct it to NYCC.** Please note the Town Farm car park is owned and regulated by Ryedale District Council. The Town Council has no authority on parking.

### Post Office vans

The Town Council have been pursuing the possibility of the post office vans using the Town Farm car park rather than the on street parking. Cushman & Wakefield, who are responsible for Royal Mail management have responded explaining that they have a duty to reduce the costs to their clients and therefore will not recommend payment for parking when there is free parking available. The Town Council will continue to pursue the matter.

### Public Wifi

At the October Town Council meeting it was agreed to implement public wifi in the town centre. We are proud to be able to say that Kirkbymoorside will be the first Wifi town in Ryedale.

### Council office

The Town Council is keen to have an office in the Library and has held lengthy discussions with North Yorkshire County Council about the matter. We are now hopeful that our office will be re-located to the Library in April 2017.

### Parking Smartcard

- Available from the Post office and Penny Bank Café.
- Great value if you use the car parks less than once a week.
- Costs £12 and gives you £10 half price parking credit at the machine and £2 for cost of card.

### Council Tax/Precept

Each Year the Town Council decides how much the precept will be for the next financial year. The precept is money which is collected from you through Council Tax by Ryedale District Council and which the Town Council then uses to fulfill its responsibilities.

After careful consideration by the Finance Committee and the full Council it has been agreed that the precept should remain at £73,500 for the year 2017/18. This is the fourth consecutive year that the Town Council has kept the precept at the same level while ensuring that all services have been maintained. Council members expressed their thanks to the Town Clerk for her efforts in making this achievable and noted that the current precept is £24,500 per year less than it was six years ago.
