STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The company is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. It is a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006. The charity uses the working name of Next Steps.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Trustees are selected from service users and local professionals. Nominated trustees are proposed and seconded by the members and trustees of the charity. Currently the committee has 7 trustees who are service users and it is the aim of the charity to maintain this level of service user representation on the committee.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The support of persons within Ryedale who have, or have previously experienced mental health issues and carers of such persons, in particular, but without limitations by the provision of resource centres offering assistance, support and information to such persons by outreach projects and activities.

Public benefit

The trustees have had due regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2016

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Chairman's Statement

These accounts for the financial year ended 31 March 2016 show strong progress in restoring the Organisation's balances to a position that meets its Reserves Policy whilst in a difficult financial climate. The results show a positive outturn resulting from considerable operational effort to develop and maintain its Aims and Objectives.

Next Steps continues to grow and raise its standards in providing support to its ever increasing number of service users. Under the guidance of its Service Manager, Leisa Burniston, the Organisation has developed additional services and facilities at its Norton base and successfully expanded the outreach services in Pickering where the number of service users has more than doubled. To Leisa and her dedicated small number of staff, I would like to express my sincere gratitude for their dedication to work in sometimes difficult circumstances.

The development of Next Steps over the next five years is very much secured with a successful Big Lottery Bid of £345,235, which was approved by the Big Lottery Fund in July 2016 and commenced on 1 November 2016. This funding will enable Next Steps to expand on its delivery of services from Norton, Pickering and Kirkbymoorside, but with a major emphasis on taking its services to the rural and remote areas of the Ryedale District.

Next Steps relies on funding for its core services from North Yorkshire County Council, the Clinical Commissioning Group for Scarborough and Ryedale, and numerous funding organisations and trusts listed later in these accounts. Without their support both financially and in resources, it would be very difficult to continue as we are. On behalf of Next Steps, I would like to publicly thank them all for their ongoing support and/or one off donations. Although we have secured Lottery Funding for the next five years, that funding does not include our core costs and these have to be annually met for us to continue as we are.

Next Steps exists to make a positive difference to peoples' lives, especially those with some form of mental health issue, those that are lonely and/or isolated, and the carers of such people. As Chair of this Organisation, I can see at first hand the difference we make to peoples' lives and that is why all the Trustees and our large team of unpaid Volunteers give so readily of their time. To all of them I give my sincere thanks because without their efforts we could not provide the services we do and not be as successful as we are.

I look forward to the next financial year knowing that we have a very dedicated team that will deliver excellent support and services not only to existing service users but to new ones in the vast rural area of Ryedale.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The day to day running of the charity was delegated to L Burniston, the administration officer.

During the year the charity ran a drop in centre, cafe and various activity groups for the benefit of its members. Volunteers assisted the charity in the provision of its services to its members.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The charity aims to hold in the unrestricted general fund approximately one quarter of the annual projected expenditure for the forthcoming year. The trustees recognise that, whilst the situation has improved, this has not been achieved in 2016.

Funds in deficit

The Trustees are aware that the general fund is, at present, in deficit. This was caused in 2014 by the poor economic situation over the last few years causing the reduction of funding for charitable enterprises. They are actively seeking ways to address this situation and have reduced the deficit by £4,048 in 2016. They are confident that they will be able to realise a surplus on general funds in the future.

Statement of Trustees Responsibilities for the Year Ended 31 March 2016

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2016

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

All income is shown gross of expenditure.

Grants

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities when they are receivable. Where the donor has imposed restrictions then the grant is treated as a restricted fund.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery etc

- 50% on cost

Items of equipment costing less than £500 are not capitalised.

Tavation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Going concern

The accounts are prepared on the going concern basis. The Trustees are aware that the general fund is in deficit but are confident that the charity can generate funds to ensure its continuation. They, therefore, believe that the accounts should be drawn up on the going concern basis.

19. POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

Since the year end, the company has been successful in obtaining a grant from "The Reaching Communities Fund" for £345,235, which is to extend the current hours of opening in Norton, Pickering and Kirbymoorside and to take its services to the rural areas of Ryedale. The grant is spread over five years, commencing 1 November 2016.

20. ULTIMATE CONTROLLING PARTY

Due to the diverse nature of the membership of the company, no one member has control over the company.

21. STATUS

The company is limited by guarantee so has no share capital. The members have guaranteed to provide an amount not exceeding £1 each in the event of the winding up of the company.
